



Host a Community Meetup in Your City

Become a HackerOne Ambassador and bring hackers together with a community meetup in your city! Invite your local hacker community together to hack on awesome public targets! Share resources, develop technical skills, network with other hackers, and earn bounties hacking on a public bug bounty program. Interested in hosting this meetup in your area? Read on for more details about what's included and the requirements.

What's Included from HackerOne:

- Social Media Promotion on Twitter for pre, during, and post-event recaps
- HackerOne Swag for up to 25 hackers
 - Subject to shipping availability in your region
- HackerOne to sponsor food or drinks for 25¹ participants
- An H1 team member and client is not guaranteed to attend in person
- Assistance coordinating with and selecting a public, managed program² to hack against
- HackerOne to set up private Slack instance for host to coordinate with event participants, as desired
- Peer-voted Award

To be Considered Event Host Must Have:

- Demonstrated a desire to support the hacker community and work together with other hackers, through platform interactions or observed social media engagement
- Exhibited professionalism in platform interactions
- No [code of conduct](#) violations in the past 12-months

Host Responsibilities:

- Venue selection and contracting including day-of-event setup and teardown, planning, support and hacker coordination.
- Source local hackers³ and send invitations via <https://www.meetup.com/> or alternate method
- Communicate with attendees and the HackerOne team through the H1-managed private event Slack or other platform
- Target selection (HackerOne team can provide guidance with this and must approve prior to announcing publicly)
- Event branding should be: <city> Community Hacking Meetup, Powered by HackerOne
- HackerOne will **not** provide live triage
- Live leaderboards are reserved for Flagship Live Hacking Events and will **not** be provided for meetup events
- Manage peer-voted award

Educational Components:

- We find that meetups are able to reach a broader audience base if an educational component is included. Whether it is a demonstration of common vulns, a deep dive into a specific bug-type, a hands-on workshop, or many other options! Partnering with local organizations or events also has proved to work well. Our

community team can work with you on what you may or may not be comfortable with and what may work with the event type, as applicable!

Program Criteria:

- Must be an active, managed, [public Bug Bounty Program](#)
- Meetup must be coordinated a minimum of 2 months in advance, depending on location allowing time for planning the event (i.e. hacker invitations, RSVP's, swag shipments, etc.)

Note: No special scope will be released for meetups; hacking will be against assets in the main public program.
